Bendigo Health

With more than 4,500 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 700 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and speciality services including; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics and Mental Health Services.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, the team provides high-quality services using the latest technologies. Our eleven operating theatres (including two endoscopy rooms), critical care, emergency and women's wards all have access to critical services lifts that link to the helipad allowing rapid transfer of patients both in and out of the health service.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

The Psychiatry Parent Infant Unit

The team is part of Bendigo Health's Mental Health Department.

A 5 bed mental health inpatient unit for parents and infants. The clinical team assess and treat the mental health of the primary caregiver and support/strengthen the attachment relationship between parent and infant. Parent Infant Unit (PIU) inpatient admissions are open to antenatal women in their third trimester of pregnancy and primary caregivers (mum, dad or carer) of infants up to the age of 12 months (unless walking) in the following circumstances: there is an existing diagnosis, or risk, of a serious mental illness with risk issues which may include the involvement of child protection, the needs and safety of caregivers and infants can be managed appropriately and safely in an open ward environment.

The Position

All units are staffed by a multi-disciplinary team made up of Psychiatrists, Medical Officers, Nursing staff, Occupational Therapists, Carer & Consumer roles and Social Workers, incorporating aspects of the Safewards model utilising the associated interventions.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

Assist in the planning, delivery and evaluation of a high standard of nursing care in consultation with the health care team, patients and carers.

To provide safe customer-focussed patient and baby care in a multidisciplinary environment.

Provide effective communication so as to include the patients' carers and the multi-disciplinary team in the immediate and ongoing health care.

Assess the need for and provide health education for patients and their carers.

Refer relevant and important issues to the Senior Nurse on duty or other health care team members.

Provide leadership and direction and act as a positive role model, providing mentorship / preceptorship to less experienced nurses, including graduate nurses and under-graduate nursing students.

Undertake (nursing) mental state, social state and physical assessments of patients, which will assist with recommendations for formulation of Individual treatment/recovery plans.

Ensure the accurate documentation of client records during the shift.

Generic Responsibilities

Code of Conduct - The Victorian Government's Code of Conduct is binding on all Bendigo Health staff. As a result, we apply the concept of the quality cycle for all our

quality activities, initiatives and projects thereby ensuring the best possible care and treatment results are achieved. The underlying principle of the cycle is that an activity is not complete until evaluation shows that it has been effective and reached the desired outcome. As a Bendigo Health employee you have a responsibility to participate in and commit to ongoing quality improvement activities using the framework of the NSQHSS (National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards).
