The Position

The Clinical Manager is a senior clinician located within the Bendigo Health Mental Health and Wellbeing Service – community clinical setting, and is accountable for the effective clinical leadership for the Short-

Term Treatment Team program. The Clinical Manager demonstrates superior consolidated clinical skills at a proficient level and the focus practice areas of psychiatric triage, intake, assessment and treatment, and psycho-education. The Clinical Manager role will provide clinical leadership and program guidance, including establishing the parameters of services, clinical standards and program objectives, and ensuring effective resource utilisation. The role will support the workforce by providing mentoring, particularly to junior clinicians, and supporting the team and other network partners to support collaborative planned treatment responses and system improvements to enhance responses for vulnerable and high-risk consumers presenting with high levels of acuity and behavioural disturbance in the community. This role actively contributes to the overall team planning to improve consumer and carer experience, through monitoring and evaluating program outcomes, and development and management of changes as appropriate.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- The Clinical Manager provides evidence based clinical leadership in the assessment, planning and delivery of recovery focused care of patients referred to the Short-Term Treatment Team for acute community management
- Leads the addressing of priority issues within the Short-Term Treatment Team which are related to the vulnerable and high-risk consumers presenting with complex need
- Facilitates the ongoing development of clinical practice in the Short-Term Treatment Team
- Identifies clinical education needs and utilises formal and informal opportunities to improve the team's knowledge and capacity to deliver high quality consumer care
- Provides mentorship as an expert clinician and positive role modelling through the maintenance of high standards of professional ethics and clinical competence
- Contributes to the developing and implementing of policy and procedures to provide for appropriate clinical practice in the acute health setting.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Bachelor of Nursing, Social Work or Bachelor of Applied Science plus post graduate qualifications in Occupational Therapy
2. Post graduate diploma in mental health and/or related field; or having completed a specialist undergraduate psychiatric program or a specialist post basic course of training.
3. Minimum of 5 years full time equivalent post registration experience in Mental Health with experience across a range of settings including psychiatric triage, assessment support and treatment of people with a mental illness and associated complex issues.
4. Demonstrated commitment and ability to practice utilising the recovery approach in mental health treatment and support, with a focus on working collaboratively with patients and carers to support progress towards reaching personal recovery goals.
5. Demonstrated expert level clinical expertise to initiate and lead evidence-based practice in the assessment, care planning and care delivery to patients with complex mental health needs and challenging behaviours.

6. Demonstrated ability to provide expert clinical consultancy, networking and dissemination of key messages across a range of key internal and external stakeholders.
7. Demonstrated ability to initiate and lead evidence-based clinical practice development and a commitment to the concept of continuous quality improvement whilst possessing excellent knowledge of Mental Health and Wellbeing Act 2022 and its associated principles.
8. Excellent verbal and written communication and interpersonal skills, with ability to engage effectively with a range of consumers, their carer's, including those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.
