The Loddon Mallee Local Health Service Network

The Loddon Mallee Local Health Service Network (LMLHSN) is collaborative partnership between public funded health services in the Loddon Mallee region, aimed at improving health care quality, safety, and service delivery across the region. LMLHSN's vision is to shape the future of health service delivery, ensuring a great person-centred care experience across the region while delivering the right care at the right time in the right place. LMHN operates under the values of Respect, Integrity, and Collaboration.

The geography of this Network spans from the more densely populated Macedon Ranges Shire in the south to the remote and more sparsely populated Mallee Region in the far northwest. This grouping reflects the existing patient flows which follow the main transport routes along the Murray River and down towards Bendigo and Melbourne. This diverse region presents unique healthcare challenges, which the LMHN addresses through a region-wide approach to service planning and delivery. The population served is 334,000 (Victoria) + 9,305 (NSW). Due to the geographical diversity of the region some of the work of the LMHN is best completed in sub-regional groupings.

The Position

The STP Data Analyst will sit within the Loddon Mallee LHSN STP program, to drive accurate data reporting to share learnings as a region. The STP Data Analyst will play a key role in enhancing the reporting capability of each of the STP projects with the support from the STP Regional Coordinator and the STP Improvement Leads where relevant. The Data Analyst will work closely with Loddon Mallee Shared Services personnel and with local digital champions within the region.

The STP Data Analyst will:

- Work closely with the SCV project team, STP Regional Coordinator and the STP Improvement Leads/STP QI Project Support Office with a focus on understanding each project metrics and project reporting expectations. Evaluate the existing reporting systems and dashboards. Recognise the best way to present project data in meaningful graphs, pie-charts and other visual tools that help tell the data story.
- Develop effective relationships across a range of internal and external stakeholders, within SCV and across LMLHSN health services.
- Work collaboratively to support the data monitoring and reporting of progress against program objectives and plans, embedding a continuous improvement approach to delivery.
- Undertake operational tasks related to the collection and cleaning of both quantitative and qualitative data.
- Support automated data processes and improve data quality.

The role reports to the LMLHSN STP Regional Coordinator and will work closely with the Loddon Mallee Local Health Services team to support broader STP projects, ensuring successful delivery of the Safer Together Program's strategic priorities.

Reporting & Compliance

- Develop and maintain Power BI dashboards and reports to support data-driven decision-making.
- Ensure data accuracy and integrity through effective data extraction, transformation, and validation.
- Create regional capability mapping and maintain clear documentation of data sources and reporting methodologies.

Stakeholder Coordination

- Work with SCV and STP ensuring clear understanding of each project's data metrics and monitor any ongoing changes.
- Collaborate with STP Improvement Leads to ensure reporting deadlines are met.
- Respond to reporting requests and data visualisation providing timely, actionable insights.

Communication & Engagement

- Present complex data in clear, visual formats tailored for various audiences.
- Communicate findings and recommendations to support informed decision-making.
- Build trust in data through transparent methods and responsive support.

Training & Education

- Deliver training and support to improve data literacy across project teams and across the LM-LHSN region in general.
- Create guides and resources to help staff confidently use reports and dashboards.
- Provide support with the Teams Assurance platform to the project teams.

Data Strategy & Innovation

- Uphold data governance standards and promote best practices in reporting.
- Identify opportunities to improve and innovate in analytics and dashboard development.

- Stay updated on tools and trends in business intelligence and data analytics.
- Engage with the Application support team to be aware of the upcoming applications roll out

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Tertiary qualification/s or a Certification in data analytics, statistics, public health, information systems, or a related field
2. Proven experience in developing interactive reports and dashboards using Power BI, with a solid understanding of data modelling, visualisation, and DAX.
3. Demonstrated skills in data extraction, transformation, and validation, with a strong focus on data quality, integrity, and compliance with governance standards
4. Ability to analyse complex data, identify trends, and translate insights into clear, actionable information for clinical and non-clinical stakeholders.
5. Ability to work both independently and as part of a team: A self-starter with a collaborative mindset—comfortable taking initiative while also being flexible and responsive within changing program environments.
6. Respect and inclusion: Works well with others to achieve shared goals—communicates openly, respects different perspectives, and helps resolve conflict constructively to support a positive team environment.

Desirable

7. Experience working within healthcare or clinical environments, particularly in projects focused on safety and quality improvement.
8. Familiarity with data governance frameworks, health data standards, and privacy compliance.
9. Experience in training, coaching, or supporting teams to build data literacy and confidence in using analytical tools and dashboards.
10. Interest in health improvement: Interest in improving healthcare systems and outcomes; clinical knowledge in a related area is welcomed but not essential.
