Bendigo Health

With more than 5,000 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 700 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, cancer and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's (including an Early Parenting Centre) areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment covering the Loddon Mallee region. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome around 1700 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 50,000 patients into the hospital each year.

The Anaesthetics and Recovery Team

The team is part of Bendigo Health's Surgical Services Department.

The Interventional Suite at Bendigo Health consists of: 11 main operating theatres, 3 procedure rooms, Sterilising Department, Stage 1, 2 and 3 recovery room areas and Day of Surgery Admissions. More than 12,000 elective and emergency surgical procedures are completed every year. Interventional suite staff are required to adapt quickly to emergency situations which can take place at any time during a 24 hour period, seven days a week. Emergencies can include critically ill, obstetrics' and trauma patients.

The Anaesthesia Team provides anaesthetic services for more than 12,000 operative procedures per year, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The service encompasses intra operative anaesthesia, pre-anaesthetic assessment, acute pain management, anaesthesia outside the operating suite and teaching and education throughout the hospital.

The team are committed to evidence based best practice, continuous quality improvement, research and teaching. Bendigo Health is associated with the recognised training programme for medical practitioners who wish to become Fellows of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (FANZCA). Registrars rotate from major teaching hospitals in Melbourne.

The Position

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The Peri Anaesthesia nurse role is an integral part of perioperative nursing practice. The Peri anaesthesia nurse provides care for patients preoperatively, during and immediately following an anaesthetic (general

anaesthesia, sedation or regional anaesthesia), surgery or any procedure that has the potential to produce life-threatening complications.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Collaborate closely with the anaesthetic and surgical teams to provide safe, customer focussed patient care throughout the pre, peri and post-anaesthetic patient journey through Bendigo Health consistent with the staff member's level on the Novice to Expert Trajectory.
- Promote patient flow through Bendigo Health, in particular the Interventional Suite, through thorough and efficient patient assessment, critical analysis of clinical data, problem solving and the institution of relevant intervention.
- Build relationships with patients/ residents and their families in order to collaborate and provide effective and safe patient care that is respectful towards individual values, customs and spiritual beliefs.
- Work as a collaborative team member to ensure the efficient, effective and safe operation of the Anaesthetic & Recovery Department.
- Practice in accordance with the Australian Nursing & Midwifery Council (ANMC) Code of Conduct, Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA) guidelines, Australian College of Perioperative Nurses (ACORN) guidelines, Australian College of Perianaesthesia Nurses (ACPAN) guidelines, National Safety and Quality Health Service (NSQHS) Standards and all other relevant professional standards.
- Maintain excellent written and electronic documentation of all patient care.
- Maintain accountability for checking of clinical equipment and ensuring its safe operation and cleanliness prior to use.
- Practice safe handling and administration of medications.
- Promote practices which comply with the policies and procedures of Bendigo Health and actively participate in the development and maintenance of relevant policies and procedures to ensure best practice.
- Participate in team/departmental and organisational meetings and service development as required.
- Provide leadership and direction and act as a positive role model providing mentorship and preceptorship to less experienced nurses, including undergraduate nursing students.
- Demonstrate a commitment to ongoing professional development; participate in relevant professional development programs and complete all mandatory training requirements.

Generic Responsibilities

Code of Conduct - The Victorian Government's Code of Conduct is binding on all Bendigo Health staff. Contravention of a provision in the code may constitute misconduct and/or regarded as a breach of the employee's employment agreement and will be dealt with under the organisations Counselling and Disciplinary Action Policy.

Compliance with policies and procedures - All Bendigo Health's policies and procedures are set out in its clinical and managerial policy manuals located on the intranet under PROMPT and in hard copy. All staff must ensure they comply with policies, procedures and standard ways of work practices when carrying out their work. Any breach in compliance may result in disciplinary action.

Occupational Health and Safety - Every staff member has the responsibility to take reasonable care of their own health and safety and the safety of others, to cooperate with Bendigo Health's OH&S policies and to participate in appropriate safety education and evaluation activities. Infection Control - Every staff member has the responsibility to minimise incidents of infection/ cross infection of residents, staff, visitors and the general public. Confidentiality - All information concerning Bendigo Health, its patients, clients, residents and staff should remain strictly confidential. Any unauthorised disclosure of such information may result in disciplinary action.

Quality Improvement - Bendigo Health is dedicated to improving the quality and safety of health services by providing care within the following domains of quality: Consumer Participation, Clinical Effectiveness, Effective Workforce and Risk Management. As a result, we apply the concept of the quality cycle for all our quality activities, initiatives and projects thereby ensuring the best possible care and treatment results are achieved. The underlying principle of the cycle is that an activity is not complete until evaluation shows that it has been effective and reached the desired outcome. As a Bendigo Health employee you have a responsibility to participate in and commit to ongoing quality improvement activities using the framework of the NSQHSS (National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards).

Diversity – Each person has a right to high-quality health care and opportunities regardless of diversity factors, which might include aspects such as cultural, ethnic, linguistic, religious background, gender, sexual orientation, age and socio-economic status. Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Current registration as a Registered Nurse with AHPRA (Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency)
- 2. Recent clinical experience in Anaesthetic and/or Recovery nursing with demonstrated clinical knowledge and skills relevant to these areas.
- 3. Demonstrated excellent communication skills with a strong focus on patient centred care.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to work independently and collaboratively as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- 5. Ability to approach difficult tasks and sudden changes appropriately.

Desirable

6. Post graduate qualification in perioperative, perianaesthesia nursing, critical care or high dependency equivalent.

Mandatory Requirements

National Police Record Check A current and satisfactory National Police Record Check must be completed by all new staff prior to commencement at Bendigo Health.

Immunisation As a health provider dedicated to providing quality patient care, we all need to be aware of the critical importance of infection control.
