The Position

Managers at Bendigo Health are an integral part of the health care service team, providing leadership and direction to a dedicated staffing group. A manager at Bendigo Health should have, or aspire, to, the personal qualities, knowledge and skills as described in the Bendigo Health Staff Capabilities Statement. Refer to link at top of page.

The 5B Associate Nurse Unit Manager (ANUM) is required to support the Nurse Unit Manager (NUM) of the Surgical Unit in leading and managing the department in line with Bendigo Health Policies, Procedures and Strategic Plans as directed and in periods of absence. They are responsible for effective and efficient management of resources in the delivery of high quality services.

The ANUM should demonstrate the application of evidence-based practice, on-going evaluation of outcomes and continual improvement in service delivery. They should also promote and support the organisational vision and standards of care. The successful applicant should possess an enthusiastic mind and be willing to be part of a hard working close knit team.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- To assist in the planning, delivery and evaluation of a high standard of nursing care in consultation with the health care team, patient and carers.
- To provide safe customer-focussed patient care in an interdisciplinary environment. To maintain and develop professional nursing standards and practice ensuring that annual competencies are met and continual learning needs are identified.
- To provide effective communication so as to include the patient, carers and the inter-disciplinary team in the immediate and ongoing health care
- To assess the need for and provide health education for patients and their carers.
- To refer relevant and important issues to the Senior Nurse or other health care team members
- To provide leadership and direction and act as a positive role model, providing mentorship/ preceptorship to less experienced nurses, including graduate nurses and under-graduate nursing students
- To work in your assigned team or within your stream as the need arises and in accordance with your clinical competencies.
- To be responsible for the checking of clinical equipment ensuring its safe operation and cleanliness prior to use.
- Ensure compliance with Bendigo Health risk management policy and guidelines.
- To promote Bendigo Health within, and external to the organisation. To communicate effectively within and external to Bendigo Health.
- To promote practices, which comply with the policies and procedures of Bendigo Health and actively participate in the maintenance of relevant policies and procedures to ensure best practice.
- To participate in service development as required.
- To participate in team/departmental meetings and other organisational meetings as required.
- To participate in staff development and training as required (including annual mandatory training in fire/emergency, 'no lift', cardio-pulmonary resuscitation & infection control), and maintain a personal record of activities completed.
- To contribute to the collection of relevant clinical data.

Employees are required to carry out lawful directions outlined above or delegated to them. The work to be performed is set out in this position description and, where relevant, any professional standards and codes of conduct and ethics issued by the relevant professional association.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Current registration as Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.
- 2. Demonstrated clinical knowledge and skills relevant to general surgery.
- 3. Demonstrated commitment to ongoing professional development.
- 4. Computer literacy and/or willingness to develop computer skills.
- 5. Ability to work as part of an inter-disciplinary team as well as independently, with an ability to prioritise, set goals & objectives.
- 6. Demonstrated knowledge, experience and application of managerial skills.

Desirable

- 7. Sound interpersonal and communication skills with a strong customer focus.
- 8. Knowledge of and experience in quality improvement activities.
- 9. Flexibility to operate in an environment of change and continuous improvement
- 10. Ability to introduce new concepts through innovation, influencing, negotiating and persuasion skills
