The Position

Bendigo Health's Intensive Care Unit is a 16-bed critical care service encompassing Intensive Care, High Dependency, and Coronary Care. The unit includes eight ventilated beds and provides care across all major specialties, with the exception of cardiac and neurosurgery. Operating at greater than 85% occupancy, the ICU manages a highly complex patient cohort, with ANZICS benchmarking data demonstrating patient acuity comparable to that of metropolitan non-teaching ICUs.

Critical care nurses within the ICU lead the response to all cardiac arrests and Medical Emergency Team (MET) calls across the hospital. In addition, the service provides an Intensive Care Liaison Nurse (ICLN) program, supporting patient flow, early recognition of deterioration, and continuity of care throughout the organisation.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- To provide safe and quality care in line with the Australian Nursing Council (ANC) national competency standards, the Code of Ethics and the Code of Professional Conduct for nurses in Australia and commensurate with level of clinical skills and experience.
- Assist in the planning, delivery and evaluation of a high standard of nursing care in consultation with the health care team.
- Provide safe customer focussed patient care in a multidisciplinary environment.
- Maintain and develop professional nursing standards and practice ensuring that annual hospital and ICU competencies are met.
- Assess the need for and provide health education for patients and carers as necessary.
- Provide excellent written documentation of all patient care given including all necessary computer data entry requirements.
- Have a good understanding of ICU admission criteria and hospital flow.
- Responsible for checking of clinical equipment and ensuring its safe operation and cleanliness prior to use.
- Promote practices which comply with the policies and procedures of Bendigo Health and actively participate in the maintenance of relevant policies and procedures to ensure best practice.
- Participate in team/departmental and organisational meetings as required.
- Participate in service development as required.
- Ensure compliance with Bendigo Health risk management policy and guidelines.
- Provide leadership and direction and act as a positive role model providing mentorship and preceptorship to less experienced nurses, including undergraduates nursing students.
- Work as allocated by the Nurse In Charge of the shift in the Intensive Care Unit. Staff with relevant experience can be allocated as access nurse, which includes attending MET call on the acute campus.
- All staff work a rotating 7 day a week roster covering days, evenings and night shifts.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Current registration as Registered Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency. Nursing and Midwifery Board Australia and a post graduate qualification in Intensive Care / Critical Care Nursing.
2. High level of self-confidence

3. Ability to interact and communicate with a diverse range of people at all levels and the ability to work as part of a team, as well as independently.
4. A willingness to learn and a personal approach which is positive, enthusiastic, friendly and helpful
5. Ability to introduce new concepts through innovation, influencing, negotiating and persuasion skills
6. Ability to care for critically unwell patients in the intensive care environment
7. Flexibility to operate in an environment of change and continuous improvement
8. Recent Intensive Care Unit experience
9. Knowledge of and compliance with ACQSHC National Standards
