### The Position

The Senior Clinical Dietitian oversees discipline-specific services within an assigned clinical caseload, working autonomously while contributing to the interdisciplinary team, particularly at a Grade Three level. The role focuses on delivering best-practice, client-centred care within Community Allied Health Services at Bendigo Health, leading and managing the Home Enteral Nutrition (HEN) portfolio, and supporting ongoing development of both Community Allied Health and the broader Nutrition and Dietetics department.

## Responsibilities and Accountabilities

## **Key Responsibilities**

- Work independently to deliver safe, evidence-based care and escalate risks or complexities appropriately.
- Provide specialist advice, lead clinical teams and support clinicians across disciplines.
- Use advanced clinical reasoning to manage referrals, waitlists and workload distribution.
- Maintain accurate documentation, reporting and adherence to organisational procedures.
- Deliver culturally responsive, client-centred care in collaboration with clients, families and multidisciplinary teams.
- Ensure effective clinical handover and smooth transitions between services.
- Identify opportunities for improvement and lead evidence-based innovation and change.
- Lead and support quality improvement and research activities, translating evidence into practice.
- Uphold safety, risk management and accreditation requirements; adjust service delivery based on evidence and feedback.
- Demonstrate advanced communication, conflict resolution, professionalism and awareness of scope of practice.
- Participate in committees, administrative portfolios and organisational activities as required.
- Provide supervision, training, induction and professional development for staff and students.
- Engage in clinical supervision, reflective practice and lifelong learning; complete mandatory training.
- Support recruitment and resource management to meet service quality and activity targets.

# Key Selection Criteria

#### Essential

- A degree in Nutrition & Dietetics or equivalent tertiary qualification with the ability to satisfy the requirements of the Bendigo Health Allied Health Credentialing and Professional Standards document, including evidence of eligibility for membership of Dietitians Australia Professional body
- 2. At least 7 years' experience relevant to discipline in a community, aged and disability setting
- 3. Demonstrated high level understanding of contemporary practice and principles and evidence based service delivery models for the community and outpatient settings
- 4. Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with multidisciplinary teams to deliver safe consumerfocused care, providing high levels of specialist knowledge
- 5. Demonstrated ability to work autonomously with highly developed skills in organisation, time management, planning and priority setting

6. Demonstrated highly developed verbal and written communication skills with the ability to interact effectively with patients, carers, staff and the community

#### Desirable

- 7. Demonstrated commitment to continuous service improvement and demonstrated experience in the leadership, evaluation and implementation of quality improvement or research activities
- 8. Demonstrated experience in initiating, responding and contributing to change and leading others through this process
- 9. Demonstrated experience to lead and deliver the professional development and education of others in highly specialised clinical skill and knowledge areas
- 10. Demonstrated ability to provide effective clinical supervision to students and staff
