The Position

The Clinical Midwifery Educator coordinates and leads learning and development opportunities for midwives within Women’s Ward, Birth Suite and Women’s Clinics as well as across Bendigo Health and to a lesser extent, regional partners. They provide clinical support to undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students, graduate midwives and new and less experienced staff in these wards/departments as well as working as part of a team flexing to support other Clinical Nurse Educators as required.

In undertaking the role, the Clinical Midwifery Educator:

- liaises with nursing and midwifery leaders to identify learning and development needs
- works closely with other members of the nursing and midwifery education team, inter-professional partners and external education providers to share knowledge and resources, reduce duplication, and enable continuous improvement in clinical learning and development.
- works with undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students, graduate midwives, and newly appointed or less experienced midwives, enabling ongoing development of clinical competence
- provides support to midwives who are supervising undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students, graduate midwives, and newly appointed or less experienced midwives
- acts as a conduit between undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students, the clinical placements team and education providers

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Coordinate Midwifery education portfolios and others as directed
- Maintain & develop Midwifery education resources such as Clinical Practice Tools, in-service templates, equipment, Midwifery Novice to Expert Trajectories, GOLD modules and others as directed
- Undertake training needs analysis to identify learning and development needs
- In collaboration with key stakeholders and other educators contribute to the design, development, implementation and evaluation of
 - Nursing, midwifery and inter-professional learning opportunities
 - programs that contribute to post graduate registration
 - programs and processes that enable expansion of scope of practice and professional development for nurses and midwives
 - other learning resources
- Support managers in provision of effective in-service nursing and midwifery education and department specific professional development
- Plan, design, develop, implement and evaluate programs for nurses undertaking postgraduate studies for midwifery registration
- Contribute to midwifery education for nurses across the Loddon Mallee region
- Incorporate best practice into learning and development opportunities
- Assist in the orientation of undergraduate, graduate, post graduate and newly appointed midwives
- Provide clinical support to undergraduate, graduate, post graduate and newly appointed and less experienced midwives, prioritising support to cohort and area with greatest development needs

- Develop and implement learning plans with undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students who are failing to meet expectations
- Conduct assessments of undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students
- Build capacity in department-based midwives to provide support and conduct assessments of undergraduate and post graduate midwifery students
- In collaboration with Managers contribute to the development and implementation of learning plans for graduate midwives and newly appointed or less experienced midwives who require specific guidance
- Provide support in clinical areas as directed during times of escalation
- Contribute to the review and development of resources that facilitate the development of competence for undergraduate, graduate, post graduate and newly appointed and less experienced midwives
- Demonstrate accountability for own professional development
- Act as a mentor and role model
- Represent midwifery education on relevant committees and working groups

Employees are required to carry out lawful directions outlined above or delegated to them.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Knowledge and clinical skills in midwifery, including evidence-based practice and clinical support models.
2. Ability to design, develop, implement, and evaluate learning programs using contemporary principles in clinical environments.
3. Skilled in conducting training needs analysis, providing assessments, and delivering effective feedback.
4. Capable of introducing new concepts through innovation, influencing stakeholders, and engaging in decision-making.
5. Able to work both as part of a team and independently.
6. Holds a postgraduate qualification or Certificate IV in Training and Assessment and is registered with AHPRA as a midwife without conditions.

Desirable

7. Strong commitment to ongoing professional development and a willingness to learn.
8. High level of self-confidence with a positive, enthusiastic, and helpful approach.
9. Ability to interact and communicate effectively with diverse individuals at all levels.
10. Flexibility to adapt to change and support continuous improvement.
