#### The Position

The Bendigo Cancer Centre has identified the development and expansion of a Survivorship Model of Care as a key priority within its Regional Cancer Services Plan 2023–2028. As part of this development, the Bendigo Cancer Centre has been awarded a Victorian Integrated Cancer Services (VICS) 2025–2026 Survivorship Grant to develop and implement an Allied Health led Survivorship Clinic within the centre.

The successful applicant will be responsible for leading all aspects of the project delivery with support provided by the Allied Health Team Leader and members of the Survivorship Working Party. This role will coordinate the development, implementation, and evaluation of the project ensuring the clinic is successfully embedded into existing services. The project officer work closely with the working party, the Loddon Mallee Integrated Cancer Service (LMICS) and will liaise with other health services within the region to determine the survivorship care needs of patients, the Project Officer will facilitate collaboration across disciplines, monitor progress, and provide regular updates and written reports to both VICS and Loddon Mallee Integrated Cancer Services (LMICS).

### **Key Responsibilities**

#### **Project Development**

- Establish project governance and reporting structures.
- Develop a detailed project plan and implementation timeline.
- Create and maintain a project database to track progress and outcomes.
- Engage and consult with regional stakeholders to ensure alignment and support.
- Conduct a survivorship care needs assessment to identify service gaps and priorities.
- Establish processes to identify patients completing treatment and transitioning to survivorship care.
- Develop protocols for acquiring and distributing treatment summaries.
- Design educational resources and promotional materials to raise awareness of the program.
- Identify opportunities to work with other health services within the region to present and promote Cancer Council Victoria (CCV) Cancer Wellness Education sessions. Create project evaluation tools to measure impact and effectiveness.

#### **Project Implementation**

- Implement survivorship assessments and structured follow-up pathways.
- Coordinate and facilitate community and regional referrals for ongoing care and support. To schedule and coordinate CCV Cancer Wellness Education Programs over the course of the year.

#### **Project Evaluation**

- Collect and coordinate participant and stakeholder feedback.
- Analyse data to assess outcomes and identify areas for improvement.
- Prepare a comprehensive final report with findings and recommendations for future service development

# **Essential**

1. **Qualifications** – A degree or equivalent tertiary qualification in an Allied Health discipline

- Registration with Professional Regulatory Body or relevant Professional Association For example, AHPRA, and the ability to satisfy the requirements of the Bendigo Health Allied Health Credentialing and Professional Standards document
- 3. **Experience** At least 7 years' experience relevant to an oncology survivorship setting and strong understanding of cancer survivorship care needs,
- 4. **Specialist knowledge** Demonstrated high level understanding of contemporary practice and principles and evidence based service delivery models for survivorship in an oncology setting including barriers and challenges to accessing appropriate services.
- 5. **Project Management** Demonstrated experience in project management, including coordinating multi-stakeholder projects or programs to achieve agreed outcomes, or the ability to apply transferable skills to such work
- 6. **Stakeholder Engagement** Exceptional influencing and relationship-management skills, with a proven ability to build and maintain effective partnerships with individuals, groups, and consumers with lived experience of cancer.
- 7. **Planning & Organisation** Demonstrated capacity to plan, prioritise, and organise own work and project resources within a dynamic environment of change and competing demands, and to meet project timelines
- 8. **Health System Knowledge** Strong understanding of the Victorian health system, Victorian Integrated Cancer Services (VICS) and Loddon Mallee Integrated Cancer Services (LMICS)
