The Position

Supporting the Victorian Department of Health Model of Care for Women’s Health Clinics the Psychologist forms an integral part of the comprehensive interdisciplinary team aimed at improving health outcomes for women. The psychologist works to integrate holistic care for women and gender diverse persons that considers the whole person not just their physical symptoms or diagnosis and promotes a participatory and empowered approach to accessing health care.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

The Psychologist in the Women's Health Clinic holds both clinical and professional accountabilities, with primary responsibility for providing specialised, evidence-based psychological services to women facing complex health issues across the lifespan. Key duties include conducting comprehensive psychological assessments and delivering tailored interventions for conditions such as chronic pain, infertility, continence issues and menopausal distress. The role requires expert skills in risk assessment and crisis management, and demands rigorous multidisciplinary collaboration with medical and allied health teams to ensure integrated, holistic care plans. The psychologist is ultimately accountable for the ethical and safe delivery of care, maintaining professional standards, and contributing to positive clinical outcomes through adherence to AHPRA guidelines and participation in service governance.

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver targeted psychological therapies specifically adapted for managing symptoms associated with perimenopause and menopause
- Provide support for body image changes, shifts in identity, and managing the psychological and intrapersonal impacts of hormonal decline
- Offer individual and couples counselling to process non-death losses associated with infertility, unsuccessful IVF cycles, or the permanent loss of reproductive capacity
- Offer grief and bereavement support to women experiencing early pregnancy loss
- Deliver psychological interventions for chronic pain resultant from menopause or pelvic floor dysfunction with aims to reduce pain interference and improve function
- Address psychosexual dysfunction, anxiety around medical examinations and integrate psychological strategies with physical therapy and medical treatment
- Participate in MDT meetings, working as a collaborative member of the interdisciplinary teams

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Current registration as a Psychologist with the Australian Health Professionals Regulation Agency including endorsement as a Clinical Psychologist, with a minimum of 5 years' experience, a master's degree in clinical psychology, eligibility for full membership of the APS and APS College of Clinical Psychologists or of an equivalent professional association (e.g., ACPA) and ability to satisfy the requirements of the Bendigo Health Allied Health Credentialing and Professional Standards document.
2. Demonstrated proficiency and capacity to deliver a range of evidence-based psychological interventions tailored to patients within a medical setting, particularly addressing the psychological components of physical symptoms and adjustment to chronic illness.
3. Proven ability to work effectively and collaboratively as an integral member of a multidisciplinary team participating in case conferencing, and contributing to unified, holistic patient care plans.
4. Demonstrated capacity to independently conduct comprehensive mental health risk assessments and manage acute psychological crises related to highly sensitive health events
5. Excellent written and verbal communication skills, including the ability to communicate highly sensitive and complex psychological information effectively and empathetically to patients, their families, and non-psychology healthcare professionals, ensuring appropriate referral pathways are initiated.
6. Commitment to maintaining professional integrity through strict adherence to the AHPRA Code of Ethics, relevant Victorian and Commonwealth legislation and engaging in ongoing professional development and clinical supervision.

Desirable

7. Demonstrated advanced clinical expertise in the psychological assessment and treatment of women and gender diverse persons presenting with complex health issues related to specific gynaecological conditions
