Bendigo Health

With more than 4,500 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 700 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 12,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, allied health, cancer and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services. Our Allied Health teams provide a diverse range of programs and person centred care in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome around 1700 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 50,000 patients into the hospital each year.

The Anaesthetics Team

Our Anaesthetic team sits within Bendigo Health's Surgical Services Department.

The Interventional Suite at Bendigo Health consists of 11 main operating theatres, 3 procedure rooms, Sterilising Department, Stage 1, 2 and 3 recovery room areas and Day of Surgery Admissions. More than 12,000 elective and emergency surgical procedures are completed every year. Interventional suite staff are required to adapt quickly to emergency situations which can take place at any time. Emergencies can include critical illness, medical and surgical emergencies, "Codes", obstetric emergencies, and trauma response.

The Anaesthesia Team provides anaesthetic services for more than 12,000 operative procedures per year, with cover 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The service encompasses pre-anaesthetic assessment, intra-operative anaesthesia, acute pain management, anaesthesia outside the operating suite and teaching and education throughout the hospital.

The team includes Staff Anaesthetics, Registrars, Anaesthetic Nurses, Administrative staff and Acute Pain Nurses. The team provide anaesthetic services to elective and emergency operating lists, and some services outside of theatre including Interventional Radiology, Cardiac Catheter Lab, and Imaging.

The team are committed to evidence based best practice, quality improvement, research and teaching. Bendigo Health is accredited for 24 months of training for medical practitioners who are training to become

Fellows of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (FANZCA). Registrars rotate from major teaching hospitals in Melbourne, and from other Critical Care departments within Bendigo Health.

The primary responsibilities of the Anaesthetics Registrars are to ensure that patient care is delivered in a safe, efficient, evidence based, cost effective manner. This will be achieved by working in partnership with the Specialist Anaesthetists. This position is designed to provide graduated levels of training and experience under appropriate (graduated) supervision.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Delivery of Anaesthesia in operating theatre under the supervision of Specialist Anaesthetists.
- Participation in on call roster providing 24 hour anaesthetic & Pain Service cover to the Hospital.
- Pre-operative assessment of patients for whom they will be delivering an anaesthetic.
- Membership of the Code Blue Team for in-hospital cardiac arrests.
- Membership of Surgical Trauma Management / Reception Team with Surgical Registrar and Emergency Department Staff.
- Participation in Quality Assurance activities of the Department, including multi-disciplinary activities.
- Liaison with Nursing and Allied Health Staff in ensuring a high standard of patient care and efficient use of available resources.
- Teaching and supervision of HMOs and Medical Students.
- Participation in an equitable manner in the on-call Anaesthetic roster.
- Other reasonable duties as specified by the Chief Medical Officer and Director of Anaesthesia.

A specific requirement of this position is continued professional development through on-the-job learning, attendance at clinical reviews, internal tutorial programs presented by Fellows in Anaesthesia and attendance at appropriate external workshops as required by their parent College.

Generic Responsibilities

Quality Improvement - Bendigo Health is dedicated to improving the quality and safety of health services by providing care within the following domains of quality: Consumer Participation, Clinical Effectiveness, Effective Workforce and Risk Management. As a result, we apply the concept of the quality cycle for all our quality activities, initiatives and projects thereby ensuring the best possible care and treatment results are achieved. The underlying principle of the cycle is that an activity is not complete until evaluation shows that it has been effective and reached the desired outcome. As a Bendigo Health employee you have a responsibility to participate in and commit to ongoing quality improvement activities using the framework of the NSQHSS (National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards).

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

Qualifications

- 1. MBBS or equivalent degree with current General Registration with AHPRA
- 2. At least 3 years post-graduate experience
- 3. Current registration (or eligible to register) with Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA).

Specialist Expertise

- 4. Demonstrated experience and skill in the medical assessment and clinical management of patients.
- 5. Thorough understanding of the relevant legislation pertaining to Medical Officers

Personal Qualities, Knowledge and Skills

- 6. High level interpersonal and communication skills and the ability to communicate confidently and appropriately with patients and their families and other health professionals
- 7. Evidence of on-going professional development to continually update personal medical knowledge and skills
- 8. Ability to effectively use organisational skills (incorporating documentation, time management skills, critical thinking and priority setting)
- 9. Ability to operate in an environment of change.
- 10. Ability to work as an effective team member in a multi-disciplinary environment as well as independently (under appropriate supervision)

Mandatory Requirements

National Police Record Check. A current and satisfactory National Police Record Check must be completed by all new staff prior to commencement at Bendigo Health.
