Medical Career Pathways with Bendigo Health

General Medicine

The Medical Services area provides a range of acute health, geriatric assessment and rehabilitation services that are predominantly delivered in an inpatient environment. In the General Medicine team, you will be a key contact for medical advice on the hospital site and whilst this can be challenging the experience will be rewarding. You may feel more visible than at larger hospitals but there will be a more senior person available to ask for advice, either in person or via phone, including your unit Consultants, the admitting consultant, Medical Registrars from other specialist teams, as well as some very experienced nursing colleagues. There will be core medical responsibilities to the Admitting team and specialist experience may occur in speciality medicine, such as Renal Medicine, Cardiology, Endocrinology, Respiratory, Gastroenterology and Oncology in the Out Patient setting.

Medical Unit structure:

- Medical wards are 4A and 5A, but medical outliers may be located elsewhere.
- Ward 4A is a general medical ward and has 4 renal dialysis beds and dialysis chairs.
- Ward 5A is a general medical ward and includes Cardiology and Oncology and there is a complex care area on 5A
- Ward 6C is a general medicine ward that includes respiratory.


