Paediatrics

The positions in Paediatrics provide extensive experience in General Paediatric Medicine, Adolescent Medicine and Neonatology. There is significant exposure to acute paediatric presentations with involvement in the Paediatric ward, emergency department, special care nursery and private consulting rooms. The Paediatric staff at Bendigo Health want you to enjoy your stay with us, have fun, learn and get hands-on experience in the field of Paediatrics as much as you can. Paediatrics is supported by VMOs and Junior Medical Staff and participates in approximately 1700 births per annum in the maternity service which offers a Women's Health Clinic, Antenatal/Postnatal area, High and low risk Birth Suites and a 10 bed Level 2 Special Care Baby Unit. The paediatric unit is involved in the management of down to 32 weeks gestation and has ready access to MRI (3Tesla), and nuclear medicine. The unit has strong links with Bendigo Community Health Services and this unit can be very busy, but very rewarding, and we will make every possible attempt to help you in the process during your stay with us.

Within the unit you will gain exposure working across the following areas:

- Children's Ward (previously known as CAU)
- Special Care Nursery (previously known as SCBU)
- Intensive Care Unit (ICU)
- Emergency Department (ED)
- Birthing Suites
- Women's Ward (previously known as Maternity /postnatal ward)
- Parent and infant unit

- 1 Accredited Advanced Skills GP registrar position - directly recruited by Bendigo Health
- 5 HMO positions - 1 one rotator from Royal Children's Hospital and 4 directly recruited by Bendigo Health

- Formal teaching at clinical handover – 3 times a week

- Paediatric teaching session for residents, registrars, and consultants - weekly

Training Pathway

Career Progression at Bendigo Health can include PGY2/3 and registrar positions that will assist in meeting the criteria for college training. One PGY2 year position is allocated to the Rural Generalist pathway stream which will fulfil the requirements to enter GP Training the following year with the option for complete a GP Registrar Paediatric Advanced Skills year. RACP training is completed through metropolitan hospitals with rotation to Bendigo Health as a HMO or Registrar.
