Bendigo Health

With more than 5000 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 724 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, allied health, cancer and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services. Our Allied Health teams provide a diverse range of programs and person centred care in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome around 1700 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 50,000 patients into the hospital each year.

The Cardiology Team

The Cardiology department is responsible for patients in several departments including inpatient wards, emergency department, ICU/CCU in addition to Cath Lab, Diagnostic Cardiology and Cardiology outpatients. The Cardiology department is led by a Clinical Unit Head and managed by a Business Manager. The department has its own bed card and also provides a consultative service to other specialties as requested. The team consists of Cardiologists, Cardiac nurses, Cardiac technologists and Cardiac Sonographers, a Cardiology registrar and an intern. This position will be expected to participate in the on call roster as required.

The Position

This is an ongoing Diagnostic Cardiologist (Imaging) appointment creating an exciting opportunity for an experienced specialist to provide diagnostic cardiology services for a leading regional health service and provision of consultative services at regular outpatient clinics.

The Fractional Specialist Imaging Cardiologist – in Diagnostic Cardiology will be responsible for performing outpatient clinic sessions as rostered, stress echo and TTE Readings.

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Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Stress echocardiography:

- Performance of a minimum of 4 stress echocardiography studies per session
- Reporting and finalisation for electronic result transfer of all stress echocardiogram studies on the same day of the procedure
- Liaison with requesting doctor and other health professionals as necessary to provide results that require immediate intervention and management

Transthoracic echocardiogram

- Reporting and finalisation for electronic result transfer of all echocardiogram studies on rostered days within 24 hours of the study
- Liaison with requesting doctor and other health professionals as necessary to provide results that require immediate intervention and management.

Tranoesophageal echocardiogram

- Performance of a transoesophageal echocardiogram as booked
- Reporting and finalisation for electronic result transfer of all stress echocardiogram studies on the same day of the procedure
- Liaison with requesting doctor and other health professionals as necessary to provide results that require immediate intervention and management

Outpatient Clinics

- Attend and consult at outpatient clinics as rostered
- Supervise junior medical staff in supporting contracted clinics as required
- Ensuring adequate communication and documentation has been completed for each patient consulted

Teaching and education

- Participation in the weekly Cardiology Case Conference
- Participation in a weekly Echocardiography meeting with Cardiology Registrars and Echocardiography Sonographers and Cardiac Technologists for both didactic and journal club lectures, and interesting cases
- Provision of support to echocardiography sonographers where necessary during a study.

Staff development and training

- Provision of education and training of echocardiography sonographer certification including training and assessment of technical skills and study interpretation, and preparation for board certification assignments and examinations
- Teaching and supervision of cardiology registrars for all aspects of echocardiography including interpretation and reporting, and performance of procedures
- Teaching and supervision of hospital medical officer/residents/medical registrars, medical interns and medical students

Others – Quality Improvement and Assurance

- Participation in department business meetings, and other organisational business and meetings as required
- Support of the diagnostic cardiology department on behalf of the clinical unit head while onsite.
- Participation in service development
- Participation in department business and case audits, including future echocardiogram registries

Generic Responsibilities

- Subspecialty training in Cardiac Imaging (echocardiography)
- Evidence of on-going professional development to continually update personal medical knowledge and skills
- Thorough understanding of the relevant legislation pertaining to Medical Officers
- Ability to operate in an environment of change
- Ability to work as part of a team as well as independently
- Demonstrated ability to communicate with patients; their carers with respect and empathy.

Desirable

• Echocardiography including transthoracic echo, exercise and pharmacologic stress echo, transoesophageal echo Certification in CT coronary angiogram and Cardiac MRI are desired qualifications but not essential.
