The Position

The purpose of this position is to provide haematology services (malignant and non-malignant) to the Loddon Mallee region. Established partnership with metropolitan services including at Peter Mac and RMH

haematology allows for shared care of patients requiring complex care not offered in the region (such as Allogeneic/Autologous stem cell transplant). This position includes clinical oversight of inpatients, a consultancy service, provision of an outpatient clinics, support of subregional hospitals (including but not limited to Echuca/Kerang/Swan hill/Kyneton cancer centres), and strategic service development.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Provides comprehensive assessment and care for patients with haematologic conditions through inpatient, outpatient, and outreach services. Actively contributes to clinical trials, quality improvement, and accreditation activities. Engages in peer review and quality assurance, and supports the development of policies, protocols, and governance frameworks within Haematology and Oncology services. Collaborates with the Director of Cancer Services and Head of Haematology on service development and strategic planning, while mentoring registrars and junior medical staff.

Key Responsibilities

Provides high quality integrated assessment and care of patients with haematologic conditions

- Participates in the Ward Service roster including on-call / recall as required
- Participation in clinical trials
- Attends outpatient clinics as rostered
- Participates in initiating and contributing to clinical trials
- Continuously reviews and improves quality processes and protocols
- Actively and regularly participates in peer review patient related activities
- Participates in Quality Assurance activities
- Provision of outreach clinics as directed by the strategic plan of the haematology cancer services.
- In conjunction with the Oncology Management team, enhance the existing and future service provisions from the cancer centre to the subregional hospitals with a focus on governance.
- A willingness to mentor and provide education to the Haematology Registrar and Junior Medical Staff.
- Assist in the ongoing development of relevant Quality activities; including preparing for and meeting of Accreditation standards and relevant Clinical Indicator Programs.
- Involvement in ongoing development of policies and protocols for the delivery of services within the discipline of Medical Oncology.
- Liaise with the Director of Cancer Services, Head of Haematology, and management of the Bendigo Health in regard to service development and strategic planning.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

Medical Qualifications registerable by AHPRA

- 2. Post graduate qualifications (FRACP) in internal medicine and haematology or equivalent
- 3. Substantial experience in managing and treating patients with a wide range of haematological conditions.
- 4. Experience in conducting clinical research
- 5. Experience in medical education at undergraduate and post graduate levels
- 6. Ability to provide leadership in a multidisciplinary team setting
- 7. Good understanding of the Public Health system; in particular the clinical and quality requirements for haematology service delivery.

Desirable

- 8. Demonstrably superior interpersonal and negotiation skills.
- 9. Ability to work as part of a multi-disciplinary team, as well as independently.
- 10. Demonstrated ability to participate in audit and in the audit feedback cycle.
- 11. Evidence of on-going professional development to continually update personal medical knowledge and skills.
