The Position

Youth Prevention and Recovery Care (YPARC) is a 10 bed 'step up step down' program between inpatient units and the community where it provides a safe and supportive community-based environment for persons aged 16-25 years requiring additional support with their mental health needs.

YPARC is run in partnership with MIND Australia to provide a recovery and prevention focus with a psychosocial rehabilitation program. YPARC has a maximum length of stay of 28 days and is a multidisciplinary team including a Psychiatrist and Registrar. Shift work is required, excluding night shift.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

In a multi-disciplinary integrated community mental health and wellbeing team, and under the direction of the Team Psychiatrist(s), Senior Clinician and Manager:

- Provide assessment and clinical treatment for patients and provide support and education to their families and carers
- Provide support/supervision to junior staff/students
- Participate in a range of bio-psycho-social treatment modalities in both individual and group settings in the residential facility
- In consultation with the patient, family and carer(s), and other care providers including YPARC psychosocial partner, formulate, negotiate, document, monitor and maintain a Recovery Plan for each patient of the service, and complete other documentation, including Outcome Measures, as per service policy
- Identify, engage and include other key community agencies and service providers involved in the
 provision of rehabilitation, recovery, support, and discharge planning consistent with the patients
 and family/carer(s) needs
- Participate in community consultation, awareness and education activities and develop community resources to increase the understanding of psychiatric disorders and service delivery models in the community
- Participate in Multi-disciplinary Team processes and provide sound discipline specific advice to other clinicians and staff within the team
- · Depending on service requirements work flexible hours, including weekends, as directed
- Perform other duties as directed

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Current registration as Registered Nurse or Occupational Therapist with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) or; Social Worker membership/meets the eligibility requirements for membership, with the Australian Association of Social Work.
- 2. Post graduate qualifications in mental health and/or related field/or relevant experience.

Desirable

- 3. At least two years work experience, in either inpatient or community based psychiatric triage, assessment, support and treatment of people with a mental illness and associated complex issues
- 4. Experience working with the Mental Health and Wellbeing Act 2022 and relevant state-wide Psychiatric Service Frameworks Procedures and Guidelines and Bendigo Health policy and procedures

- 5. Experience in, and demonstrated commitment to, an integrated community based treatment model for people with a mental illness and associated complex issues
- 6. High level of organisational, leadership, communication and interpersonal skills with the ability to develop effective working relationships
- 7. Experience in liaising and consulting with relevant family members, team members, and a broad range of health professionals and community agencies
- 8. Knowledge of Quality Improvement and flexibility to operate in an environment of change and continuous improvement
