Bendigo Health

With more than 4,500 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 700 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, allied health, cancer and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services. Our Allied Health teams provide a diverse range of programs and person centred care in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome around 1700 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 50,000 patients into the hospital each year.

Cancer Services

The Bendigo Cancer Centre is a partnership between Bendigo Health and Peter MacCallum Cancer Institute, which brings together Medical Oncology and Radiation Oncology treatment and consultative services, with the support of palliative care, allied health, specialist nursing staff, pharmacy, clinical trials, MDM meetings and outreach clinics.

The radiotherapy service is provided by Peter Mac (Victorian Comprehensive Cancer Centre) and managed by a Site Manager and Clinical Director. Bendigo Health is responsible for radiotherapy nursing staff only. The Haematology Service is provided conjointly by Bendigo Health and Peter Mac (Parkville Clinical Haematology). The Bendigo Chemotherapy Day Unit (CDU) is a day-stay unit providing a wide range of chemotherapy, hormonal therapy and biological response modifiers and symptom support as well as access to clinical trials. Additional treatments may be delivered at Parkville as required.

Cancer clinics operates outpatient consulting clinics including medical transcription typing and MDM Coordination.

Patient care is provided by a multi-skilled team consisting of: medical oncologists, palliative care physicians, haematologists, medical oncology registrars and interns, clinical nurse specialists, oncology nurse practitioners, a haematology nurse coordinator, and oncology nurses who are specialists in chemotherapy administration and management, as well as allied health professionals.

The purpose of this position is to provide comprehensive oncology services in both inpatient and outpatient settings including outreach, on call and weekend cover. As part of a collaborative team of consultants, you will contribute to enhancing cancer services across the Loddon Mallee Region, with a strong focus on continuous improvement, clinical leadership and clinical research, helping to drive innovation in oncology care while improving health outcomes for our community.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Provision of Medical Oncology services to patients of Bendigo Health at both inpatient and outpatient levels, including on call and weekend cover across multiple sites including Bendigo Health and other outreach health service partners.
- Provide leadership in increasing research opportunities and be directly involved in the running of cancer trials within the cancer centre
- Provision of outreach clinics as directed by the strategic plan of the medical oncology cancer services
- In conjunction with the Oncology Management team, enhance the existing and future service provisions from the cancer centre to the subregional hospitals with a focus on governance.
- Actively and regularly participates in peer review patient related activities
- A willingness to mentor and provide education to the oncology Registrar and Doctor's in Training
- Involvement in ongoing development of policies and protocols for the delivery of services within the discipline of Medical Oncology.
- Assist in the ongoing development of relevant Quality activities; including preparing for and meeting of Accreditation standards and relevant Clinical Indicator Programs.
- An expectation to support and develop clinical trials within the cancer centre
- Liaise with the Clinical Director of Oncology and management of the Bendigo Health in regard to service development and strategic planning.

Generic Responsibilities

- Evidence of on-going professional development to continually update personal medical knowledge and skills

Desirable

- Experience in medical education at undergraduate and post graduate levels
- Demonstrably superior interpersonal and negotiation skills
- Ability to work as part of a multi-disciplinary team, as well as independently.
- Demonstrated ability to participate in audit and in the audit feedback cycle.
