### About us

### Bendigo Health Accelerator

Bendigo Health is proud of being a trailblazer and has a proven track record in regional health leadership.

We were the first to conduct the only regional health sector-specific Accelerator program and create an Innovation Space within the hospital designed to foster collaboration and co-design with clinicians, innovators and entrepreneurs.

Our formalised health partnership joint venture agreement with 15 rural and regional health services provides access to an almost 10,000 strong health workforce.

Our continued collaboration with Melbourne Health provides access to approximately 8,000 additional health workers. The potential for immersion in 16 health services supported by 18,000 health care workers is a unique offering that ensures Founders and Startups are guaranteed the real world of health experience.



### Introduction

The Victorian Health Network
Accelerator (VHNx) Project is a
successful collaboration between
Melbourne Health and Bendigo
Health.

The VHNx supported two Startup cohorts to accelerate their journey through the Melbourne Health Accelerator (MHx) and the Bendigo Health Accelerator (BHx) programs.

The BHx is based on the highly successful MHx model, recently cited by Startup Genome in their "The Global Startup Ecosystem Report 2021 – Life Sciences Edition" as one of the top accelerators in the Oceania region.

Eighteen Startups graduated from the VHNx and are already reaping the benefits. The seven MedTech and medical device startups (including three from regional Victoria, three female founders and two from the Loddon Mallee region) who graduated from the inaugural BHx program have already created an additional 60 direct jobs. Five of these startups are developing research or service agreements with local health services.

"Over \$3 million in capital has been raised by the Bendigo **Health Accelerator Startups** post-program. After only one program, we demonstrated that the BHx hospital immersion component services a niche market need by facilitating access to the real world of the health system. ## Consumer demand

In a sector such as health, where resources are being stretched by a ballooning ageing population and increasingly empowered health consumers with radically changing needs and expectations, community needs are going unmet. It makes sense to tap into the existing consumer demand and accelerate solutions that transform health care organisations and global systems to meet our community's needs.

One way to help is to foster the translation of ideas and research into commercial companies and build a much-needed supply chain to meet our global community's current and future health needs.

#### Reciprocal benefits:



Health Services will benefit by providing an opportunity for Startups and clinical entrepreneurs to access the health system via the hospital immersion component of the program. This 'living lab' experience helps health services foster an innovation culture, build our digital health capability and shape solutions that translate into practice.

Startups are provided access to a multidisciplinary pool of stakeholders called Innovation Leaders. The purpose and value of providing such access are for Founders to validate their solution design with clinicians and health professionals, helping them on their commercialisation journey.



This is an imperative component in helping craft their commercial offering so that it not only solves a real-world health problem, but also has a global reach and works within system structures and funding models.

### Market need

The BHx is the only Health industry-led Accelerator providing real-world access to our health and hospital system. We are also the only pre-accelerator and accelerator program in regional Victoria, servicing the health sector in a real-time digitally enabled hospital.

This provides a unique opportunity for Startups to address health problems in smaller hospitals. These leadership teams are smaller and, by design, have to be closer to clinicians and consumers, which can inherently provide greater value. Products trialled are scalable to larger hospitals and global markets.



At a glance




In capital was raised by Startups post-BHx

## Success stories Startup

Megan Gomez credits the MHx with helping develop and test the program to ensure it was market-ready. The MHx and BHx give healthcare-related Startups access to clinicians in a hospital setting to refine, test and re-evaluate their ideas. Megan's idea became a reality with the successful launch of Rural Health Connect in September 2019.

In her role as Startup in Residence, Megan mentored the BHx cohort. Megan found that she could also develop further her own business through her relationships built through the BHx team. A win-win situation for Bendigo Health, Rural Health Connect and Victoria.

### Dr Cameron Knott, Lead Innovation Leader



Cameron works clinically as an Intensive Care Medicine specialist. His Bendigo Health role is the Deputy Clinical Unit Head of the Bendigo Health Intensive Care Unit (ICU). He also maintains links with the Austin Health ICU in Melbourne. Cameron works for Monash University as a Senior Lecturer and Academic Lead of the Clinical Skills and Simulation Centre, Monash Rural Health Bendigo. This role supports the Bendigobased Monash University and University of Melbourne medical student programs for learning safe clinical skills for working doctors-in-training.
